#### **Common Council Minutes**

MEETING DATE: Tuesday, December 2, 2025, at 5:30 PM

MEETING PLACE: City Hall, 101 W. Main Street, Madison, IN 47250

The Common Council of the City of Madison, Indiana, met in regular session at 5:30 P.M. at City Hall, 101 W. Main Street, Madison, IN 47250.

Mayor Bob Courtney opened the meeting with the Lord's Prayer, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

**Present:** Thevenow, Krebs, Dattilo, Wilber, Schafer, and Bartlett were present. Storm was present via electronic participation (7-0).

**Minutes:** Bartlett moved to approve the minutes of the November 18, 2025, regular meeting, seconded by Krebs. All in favor, motion carried (7-0).

**Presentation of petitions, memorials, remonstrances, introduction of motion & guests: MPD Chief of Police Swearing In Ceremony:** During the meeting, Rick Mundt, who had been serving as the Interim Chief of Police, took his Oath of Office to formally assume the role of Chief of Police. The Police Department also announced leadership enhancements with the appointment of Detectives Ricky Harris and Kyle Cutshaw as co-Assistant Chiefs. Both will continue performing their duties as Detectives while taking on these additional responsibilities. Ricky and Kyle each took their Oaths of Office during the meeting to formally enter their new roles. Councilmember Bartlett read a brief statement of support from the President of the Police Merit Board, Dave Adams.

**Resolutions or Bills: Resolutions 2025-19C and 20C: Misc. Year-End Transfers: Motion:** Bartlett moved to approve Resolutions 2025-19C and 20C, seconded by Schafer. **Roll Call Vote:** Thevenow – Y, Krebs – Y, Storm – Y, Dattilo – Y, Schafer – Y, Storm – Y, Bartlett – Y, Wilber – Y. All in favor, resolution passes (7-0).

Reports, recommendations, other business from standing/select committees of the city council: None.

**Report of city officials: Vacant and Abandoned Structures Update - Duey O'Neal:** Per a requirement in the vacant and abandoned structures registry ordinance, the Code Enforcement Officer is responsible for updating the BPWS quarterly. The same presentation was also presented to the council. A copy of the full presentation is available for viewing on the City of Madison YouTube channel.

**Board Appointments:** The council was provided a committee roster and board appointment recommendations in their packets. The mayor listed the recent appointments and reappointments that he has made that will be in the updated roster. There are five reappointments that the Mayor is asking the council to approve. These appointments are for the Historic District Board of Review (HDBR) and Public Arts Commission. These are mayoral appointments with council consent. The council has three appointments for approval for PACE and JCBT. Mayor Courtney is asking for the approval of three HDBR members and two Public Arts Commission members, as noted in their packet. **Motion:** Schafer moved to approve the mayor's recommendations for the five appointments, seconded by Thevenow. All in favor, motion carried (7-0). **Motion:** Thevenow moved to nominate Laura Lawson to PACE, Matt Chandler to JCBT, and Renie Stephans to JCBT, seconded by Krebs. All in favor, motion carried (7-0).

Bills on second reading: None.

**Public comment (per sign-up sheet):** Sandy Palmer, of 105 E. Third Street, noted that the Salvation Army is in need of volunteers for the winter warming shelter during periods of cold weather.

**Mayor's comments:** Tomorrow, there will be a local officials workshop in the council chambers for an overview by the planning consultant, Amy Williams. There has been a steering committee that has been working for the past 11 months on modernizing the city's zoning ordinances. The 2026 budget has been fully adopted and approved by DLGF. There is a workshop this Thursday, partnered with the Southern Indiana Regional Planning Commission, for an owner-occupied rehabilitation housing program. The Welch Park plans are now out to bid, and the bid opening will be December 18, 2025.

#### **CONDITION OF ELIGIBILITY**

All Madison Riverfront District Renewal Permit applications will be under review by the Economic Development Department, the Mayor, and City Council of the City of Madison.

If the renewal application is approved the Mayor will give the applicant a signed letter to that effect.

The applicant is responsible for contacting the City Planner, City Building Inspector and/or the City Zoning Board, to mutually identify any information, that is not applicable, needed for following City Ordinances and Permit Process. The applicant is required to provide any other information requested by the City of Madison, and the Economic Development Department, to demonstrate compliance, with the requirements of the Riverfront District Permit.

Restaurants receiving one, two, or three-way licenses, within the District, will be required to sell a minimum of \$200,000 in gross food sales, for the first two years, and \$275,000 for the third year and beyond. The restaurant must be open a minimum of 240 days per year.

Cultural experience venues receiving one, two or three-way licenses within the District will be required to have a minimum performance capacity of 125 people and must adhere to the state minimum of food requirement under, 905 IAC 1-20-1, under the authority of IC 7.1-3-20-9.

As part of the yearly license renewal, applicants will have to demonstrate that these requirements have been met at the location for which the license has been granted, in addition to the requirements of the City of Madison application process.

Permits are not transferable, not portable within or without the district and any renewals are subject to compliance, with the terms of these local rules, and any agreement negotiated with the City of Madison. The permits shall not be pledged as collateral, or subject to any lien, judgment, property settlement agreement, or third-party claim.
