MEETING DATE: July 5, 2023

MEETING PLACE: Madison City Hall – Council Chambers

The Common Council of the City of Madison, Indiana met in regular session at 5:30 P.M. at City Hall, 101 W. Main St.

Mayor Courtney opened the meeting with the Lord's Prayer followed by the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Present: J. Bartlett, D. Dattilo, Krebs, J. Schafer, Chatham, and Thevenow (6-1). L. Dattilo was absent and excused from the meeting.

Minutes: Thevenow moved to approve June 20, 2023, minutes, seconded by Chatham. All in favor, motion carried (6-0).

Public comment: Debbie Beemon, Walnut Street, wanted to make the council aware of the state of the abandoned houses in her neighborhood, especially 709 Walnut Street. She mentions how unsafe the structures are for children and the community in general and how overtaken they can get by the homeless population.

Mayor's comments: June 2023 was an extremely busy and successful month for the city in many ways. Mayor Courtney would also like to encourage the community and the council to go to the City of Madison website and look at all of the content that is available there. There is a lot of information regarding the projects that are being worked on and where they are taking place. The Crystal each Project webcam is also live now where the community can view the progress of the project in real time. Regatta 2023 was an extremely successful event. The city's estimates were that there were about 20,000 people on the riverfront plus their children for the fireworks show on Saturday night. There were about 8,000 lining Main Street for the parade plus their children on Friday night. The mayor thanked everyone involved in the 2023 Regatta events that took place over the weekend, including the Regatta committee, staff, businesses, race crews, public safety, law enforcement, and the community. The city is currently reviewing the data prepared by the Army Corps of Engineers.

There will be announcements made regarding that information soon as it is a very complicated dataoriented analysis of the Crooked Creek Watershed. This will bring some solutions to the community for flooding in that corridor.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MADISON, INDIANA ESTABLISHING THE DAVE KIDWELL MEMORIAL LIGHTING NON-REVERTING FUND

WHEREAS, Dave Kidwell was a long-time employee of the City of Madison and created beautiful, handmade lighting elements to be displayed on Main Street and elsewhere in the city of Madison; and

WHEREAS, the City of Madison wishes to establish a fund to deposit memorial funds along with other funds raised for lighting and pay expenses related to the lighting displays,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Common Council of the City of Madison, Indiana as follows:

- (A) A fund is established for the purpose of depositing monies for the purchase of materials and supplies for creating new lighting elements as well as the purchase of new displays as needed. The monies will come from donations, fundraisers, sale of merchandise, sponsorships, appropriations from city accounts or from any other lawful source.
- (B) The fund shall be named the Dave Kidwell Memorial Lighting Non-Reverting Fund. All funds contained in the account shall be expended only for the exclusive purpose of paying for creating, purchasing, and maintaining light displays. These expenses may include equipment, materials, ready-made items, matching funds for grants, fundraising expenses, and any other expenses related to holiday displays throughout the city. The express and written approval of the Board of Public Works and Safety shall be obtained prior to the expenditure of funds from the account.
- (C) The fund shall be non-reverting and exist perpetually unless terminated by a subsequent ordinance enacted by the Common Council.
- (D) If the fund is terminated by a subsequent ordinance enacted by the Common Council, the remaining balance of the terminated account shall revert to the general budget of the Common Council.

2.0 CONTRACT REQUIREMENTS

- As a requirement of the Community Crossings grant funding utilized for this project, the prime contractor to whom the work is awarded must be prequalified with INDOT. Subcontractors can enter into subcontracts up to \$300,000 without being prequalified with INDOT; however, the subcontractor is limited to a total of \$300,000 in unearned work under contract on any given date with any owner, contractor, or other party.
- 2.2 The CONTRACTOR shall provide an executed contract, bonds and all other necessary documents to the OWNER within ten (10) days of award in order for the OWNER to forward these documents to the Indiana Department of Transportation as a requirement of the grant funding.






